**For the purpose of this application, a tribal sexual assault program is described as:**

A tribal organization that provides intervention and related assistance to victims of sexual assault without regard to their age. Tribal agencies that apply may not be part of the criminal justice system (such as a law enforcement agency) and must be able to offer a comparable level of confidentiality as a nonprofit entity that provides similar victim services. Intervention and related assistance may include:

- 24-hour hotline services providing crisis intervention services and referral.
- Accompaniment and advocacy through medical, criminal justice, and social support systems, including medical facilities, police, and court proceedings.
- Crisis intervention, short-term individual and group support services, and comprehensive service coordination and supervision to assist sexual assault victims and family or household members.
- Information and referral to assist the sexual assault victim and family or household members.

- Community-based, culturally specific services and support mechanisms, including outreach activities for underserved communities.
- Development and distribution of materials on issues related to the services described above.

**Tribal Agencies: Sexual Assault Services Application (Up to \$50,000 per tribe)**

Applications will be accepted only from tribal programs that do not currently receive Support Services for Sexual Assault Survivors funding under contract 437003-G22-0001955-000.

Every tribal specific program that responds and provides a complete and accepted application will be awarded the Tribal Support Services for Sexual Assault Survivors funding up to \$50,000.
