

Building Inspection Report – Licensed Child Care Centers

Use of form: Use of this form is voluntary; however, completion of this form by the inspector will be accepted as documentation that the structure meets the requirements of DCF 250.06 (1) (a), 251.06 (1) (a) or 252.43 (1) (d) for child care centers required to meet commercial building codes. Personal information you provide may be used for secondary purposes [Privacy Law, s.15.04 (1) (m), Wis. Stats].

Instructions – Owner / Occupant / Applicant for licensure: Complete Section A and give the form to the commercial building inspector, registered architect, or engineer to be completed during the inspection. Include a copy of the floor plan of all interior and exterior spaces that will be utilized by the center. Diagrams should include dimensions, a description of each room's usage, and the ages of children that will be cared for in each room. If upon completion of the inspection any applicable building codes are indicated as not met (deficient), required modifications must be made and a final inspection must be completed to document that all applicable building codes have been met. The owner / occupant / applicant must provide the department with a copy of the completed final inspection report and attached floor plan. **Note:** A license will not be issued until all applicable building codes and licensing rules have been met. DCF 251 licensing rules for group child care centers may be more restrictive than building codes for the amount of space accessible to children and the number of toilets and washbasins. See 251.06 for building requirements. Rooms used to serve children under age 2 are required to have a diaper changing sink located within the room. See 251.09 (4) (b).

Instructions – Inspector: A commercial building inspector, registered architect, or engineer shall visually observe the physical plant to determine compliance with applicable building codes and complete and sign the inspection form. If possible, include a copy of the floor plan provided by the owner / occupant / applicant as documentation that the building was inspected based on the diagram of where services will be located. Include each room inspected, any restrictions or limitations, and the ages of children for which each room was approved at the time of the inspection. **Note:** Most centers will be required to meet the I-4 building codes unless specific building elements are in place that allow for application of the E codes.
