

COUNSELOR-TO-CHILD RATIO WHILE SWIMMING WORKSHEET DAY CAMPS FOR CHILDREN

Use of form: Use of this form is voluntary. Day camps may use this form to determine the required counselor-to-child ratio while children are in the water and to help ensure compliance with DCF 252. The ratio of counselors to children may not be less than the minimum number of counselors to children specified in Table DCF 252.42.

Instructions: When there is a mixed-age group, the counselor-to-child ratio shall be adjusted on a prorata basis according to age.

CRITERIA

1. The camp shall maintain a ratio of one person with a current Red Cross lifesaving certificate per 25 children in the water.
2. Each camp offering water activities shall designate a staff person as waterfront supervisor. The waterfront supervisor shall be 18 years of age or older and hold a current certification as a life-guard from a nationally recognized certifying agency.
3. The waterfront supervisor, or equally qualified person acting as waterfront supervisor, shall be on duty at all times whenever children are in the water.
4. The waterfront supervisor, or equally qualified person acting as waterfront supervisor, may not be included in ratios during any period when children are in the water.
5. While children are in the water, all staff counted toward maintaining ratios must be able to swim.
6. Counselors shall not engage in any duties that are not related to caring for children when they are counted in meeting ratios.
7. A support staff person may only be considered in determining ratios during those hours when that person gives full attention to the care and supervision of children and if that person meets the qualifications of a counselor.

EXAMPLES

Example 1 – 6 children age 5 years and 5 children age 7 years will be served in one group.

Children age 5 years	6	.083	=	.498	
Children age 7 years	<u>5</u>	.056	=	<u>.280</u>	▶ 1 counselor who can swim and the waterfront supervisor.
Group Size	11	Counselors Required	=	.778	

Example 2 – 6 children age 3 years, 2 children age 4, and 5 children age 7 years will be served in one group.

Children age 3 years	6	.25	=	1.500	
Children age 4 years	2	.167 (.25 see no. 2)	=	0.500	▶ 4 counselors who can swim and the waterfront supervisor.
Children age 7 years	<u>5</u>	.056 (.25 see no. 2)	=	<u>1.250</u>	
Group Size	13	Counselors Required	=	3.25	

Example 3 – 16 children age 5 years and 10 children age 7 years will be served in one group.

Children age 5 years	16	.083	=	1.328	
Children age 7 years	<u>10</u>	.056	=	<u>0.560</u>	▶ 2 counselors who can swim and the waterfront supervisor.
Group Size	26	Counselors Required	=	1.888
