Review of Notice of Public Meeting

Care4Kids Update - Dr. Lisa Zetley & Dr. Kelly Hodges

- Overview of Care4Kids Program
- Enrollment by end of 2014 2500 participants. Averaging about 350 children per month from July-December 2014.
- Staffing Overview:
 - o 10 Health Care Coordinators
 - o Registered Nurses or advanced practice social workers
 - o 18 Outreach Coordinators
- Out of Home Care Initial Health Screens:
 - o Goal is to have all youth entering Out-of-Home Care (OHC) seen within 2 business days. Majority of screenings are completed by Children's Hospital of Wisconsin Child Advocacy Center by providers with expertise in caring for children in OHC.
 - o Identifying acute health concerns and/or signs of abuse or neglect
 - o Triage Levels used to organize the acute needs of each child and facilitate timely follow up care.
 - o 93% completion rate in Milwaukee County (87% completed within 5 days).

- 30 Day Comprehensive Health Exam:
 - o Center of Excellence (COE) primary care clinics with an expertise and interest in caring for youth in foster care.
 - o Exams include: comprehensive unclothed well child exam, developmental screening <4yrs, mental health screen < 4yrs, dental exam, Immunization update, review of health history,
 - o Before C4K implementation, behavioral health/developmental screens were occurring for approximately 10% of children in OOHC. Quarter 4 of 2014 screening rates were at 37%
- Comprehensive Healthcare Plan: Created within 60days of entering out of home care. Updated every 6 months (at minimum).
- Linda Davis recommends future C4K updates include aggregate health outcomes and available data that illustrates the overall health status of the enrolled population.

Child Welfare Education Collaboration Grant Update and Overview of Institute for Research on Poverty (IRP) - Wendy Henderson & Dr. Lawrence Berger

- IRP overview
- Grant used to improve educational outcomes of children in OHC as well as report data on the link between foster care and education.
- Data from just over 200,000 children that experienced OHC
- Data Pools: CARES, KIDS, and WiSACWIS
- Study will continue with further analysis of different types of OHC (familial, foster care, residential treatment, treatment foster care).
