Background and Purpose


The Independent Monitoring Report serves as a mechanism for maintaining transparency to both internal and external stakeholders while providing information about the functioning of the Division of Milwaukee Child Protective Services' child welfare system. This report expands on information historically included in the Settlement Agreement and includes information about:

- Safety
- Permanency
- Well-being
- Workforce



Access: Volume of Child Protective Service (CPS) Reports January through June (2019 through 2023)






Five-Year Trend of CPS Reports by Year (2019-2023):

- A total of 14,967 CPS
 Reports were received from
 January through December
 2023
- There were **953** more **(6.8%** increase) CPS Reports received in 2023 than in 2022

Access: Volume and Response Time of Child Protective Service (CPS) Reports





CPS Reports by Month (January-December 2023):

- On average, **1,247** CPS reports received per month
- On average, 527 (42.2%) CPS Reports screened-in
- A total of 6,321 CPS reports were screened-in


Reporters:

 72.4% of reports were received by mandated reporters

Screened-In Response Times (average):

- **22.0**% Same Day
- 19.5% within 24-48 hours
- 58.5% within five business days

Initial Assessments and Independent Investigations






Initial Assessments (IA) and Independent Investigations (January-December 2023)

- 6,076 IAs completed
- 102 Independent Investigations completed
- An average of 65 DMCPS staff completed an average of 506 Initial Assessments per month
- Professional Services Group /
 Community Impact Programs
 (PSG/CIP) staff completed an
 average of **nine** Independent
 Investigations each month

Timeliness of Completing Initial Assessments (IA) and Independent Investigations (January-December 2023):


 3,689 (59.7%) of 6,178 of the Initial Assessments and Independent Investigations were completed within 60 days

Initial Assessment Staffing:

- At the beginning of 2023, there were 73 initial assessment specialists (IAS)
- 27 IAS were hired, and 23 IAS separated employment resulting in a turnover rate of 23.0% for calendar year 2023

Safety: Re-Entry, Face-to-Face Contacts, and Maltreatment





Re-Entry (January-December 2023):

54 children re-entered out-of-home care within 12 months

Face-to-Face Contacts (January-December 2023):

• **95.9%** of **19,451** expected visits occurred

Maltreatment by Provider to Child(ren) in OHC (January-December 2023)




Safety: Maltreatment over Time

Permanency: Entries into Out-of-Home Care






Entries in Out-of-Home Care (January-December 2023):

- At the beginning of 2023, there were **1,802** children in OHC
- On average per month, **58** children entered OHC and **62** children exited OHC
- At the end of 2023, there were 1,721 children in OHC

Permanency: Placement Groups





Placement Types (January-December 2023):

- On average, 85.0% of children were placed in a family-like settings
- On average, **9.6**% of children were placed in congregate care
- On average, 5.4% of children were in other settings


Relative Placements: (January-December 2023):

On average, 39.1% of children were placed with relatives

Youth 12 years and older (January-December 2023):

- On average, **533** children
- Of these children, 53.3% were placed in a family setting

Permanency: Foster Homes






Foster Homes (January – December 2023)

- **519** foster homes (annual average)
- 167 providers newly licensed
- 211 providers licenses were closed

Permanency: Length of Stay in Out-of-Home Care






Length of Stay (January-December 2023):

- 1,746 is the semi-annual average number of children in out-of-home care (OHC)
- 628 (36.0%) is the semi-annual average number of children in OHC longer than 24 months.

Permanency: Discharge Reasons






Discharge Reasons (January-December 2023):

- 744 children discharged from Out-of-home Care
 - 324 to reunification
 - 150 to guardianship
 - 180 to adoption
 - 90 to other

Timeliness to Permanency (January-December 2023):

- 135 of 324 (41.7%) reunified within 12 months
- **64 of 150 (42.7%)** had a guardianship within 24 months
- 49 of 180 (27.2%) children were adopted within 24 months

Well-being: Annual Medical and Dental Exams





Medical (January-December 2023):


 On average per month, 1,547 of 1,757 children (88.0%) were current and documented their annual medical exams

Dental (January-December 2023):

 On average per month, 1,031 of 1,437 children (71.7%) were current and documented their annual dental exams

Workforce: Child Welfare Case Manager Staffing and Caseload





Child Welfare Case Manager Staffing (January-December 2023):

- At the beginning of 2023, there were
 143 child welfare case managers
- 80 staff were hired
- **59** staff separated employment
- At the end of 2023, there were 164 child welfare case managers
- 26.5% staff turnover rate

Caseloads for Child Welfare Case Managers (January-December 2023):

On a yearly average, 67.8 of 155.3
 (43.7%) case carrying child welfare case managers (CWCM) had more than 15 children on their caseload

Summary of Performance – Key Takeaways

- The screen-in rate for 2023 was 42.2%. This is the lowest rate reported dating back to 2007 (consistent with the statewide trend)
- Fifty-four children re-entered OHC within 12 months (19 more than 2022)
- Twelve children were victims of maltreatment while in OHC
- The total number of children in OHC continues to decrease (1,721 children at the end of 2023)
- Staffing of initial assessment specialists (IAS) and child welfare case managers (CWCMs) showed significant improvement and stabilized from the prior two years
- Caseloads improved and the number of CWCMs with more than 15 children on their caseload decreased significantly from last year
