Prevention Services and Preventing Out of Home Care Removals

- What have we done?
 - Evaluation of children whose out-of-home care stay was 6 months or less (shorter stays)
 - 87 Children were removed and reunified within 60 days
 - 71% reunified within 7 days
 - 7% reunified within 8 – 30 days
 - 22% reunified within 31 – 60 days



Prevention Services and Preventing Out of Home Care Removals

- What have we done? Cont.
 - Prominent Danger Threats identified fell in the Neglect category
 - The most common Present Danger Threat identified was Parent and/or caregiver is unwilling/unable to perform basic care
 - 2nd Present Danger Threat identified was Parent's whereabouts are unknown
 - The most common Impending Danger Threat identified was No Adult in the home will perform parental duties and responsibilities in line with the child's individual developmental needs
 - The 2nd Impending Danger Threat identified was one or both parent/caregiver's has impulsive behavior that they cannot/will not control





- What have we done? Cont.
 - Other quantitative data we Collected/Reviewed
 - Focus on Neglect referrals
 - We have evaluated our referrals Access has received to understand who are our referral sources
 - Milwaukee Police Department is our highest referral source
 - The second referral source are our education partners
 - Reviewing a breakdown of zip codes to understand which areas have the highest referrals
 - The top three zip codes from 7/1/22 – 12/31/22: 53209, 53215, 53218






Count of children reported (duplicate; screen in/out)




Rate children reported (duplicate; per 1,000)
