This Best Practices guide provides a high-level overview of best practices that regulated child care providers should consider in order to continue operations or reopen. As always, the health and safety of children is the most important priority.

In recognition of the vast differences in the levels of spread of COVID-19 throughout the state of Wisconsin, as well as how quickly a change within an individual community may occur, these guidelines will assist regulated child care programs in determining their ability to increase capacity while still following applicable rules and regulations to keep children safe and healthy.
