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Section 1: Report of 2021 Activities

1. Please describe the panel's 2021 meeting schedule, including the frequency and type of panel meetings, and the frequency and type of any subcommittee and workgroup meetings.

The St Coix County CRP scheduled 12 monthly meetings during 2021. Due to the pandemic we have hadall meetings via ZOOM. Nine of twleve meetings were actually held, the others cancelled due to lack of attendance and not reaching a quorum.

The panel has grown in the past 18 months from 4 to now 9 members. The panel has been intentional in recruitment of new members, being mindful of having all sectors of the community represented. The panel also collaborated with 7 school districts in our county in distributing masks with a child abuse prevention message to both students and staff.

3. Please describe any case reviews conducted by the panel in 2021.

June, 2021: Panel conducted a case review with local CPS staff. Case involved a child with disabilities and the use of community resources to support the family.

A second case review was planned for 2021 and rescheduled repeatedly due to CPS staff shortage and turn-over

The panel provided apprreciation to CPS Staff by way of gift cards to a local coffee shop for all employees. Gift cards were also provided for CPS on-call staff to use to support children in transitionaling from one home to another. Staff report using gift cards primarily for food and clothing. Several car seats were also purchased for staff to use and provide to families in need.

CPS and Law Enforcement: CPS and Law Encorcement attended the National DEC Conference in April 2021. This opportunity was supported by both the CRP and Local DCF.

St Croix County supports and coordinates a monthly committee meeting for the purpose of recruitment and retainment of foster parents. The meeting agenda include both providing of community events for foster families to attend as well as mentoring of new foster parents. An outcome of this is a mentoring for new foster families.
