Presentation: Context Matters: The Impact of Area Deprivation and Domestic Violence Victimization Among Women in Milwaukee (see attached article)

Abdul Shour, Assistant Professor of Public Health, College of Health Science, Carroll University

Domestic violence (DV) is a major public health concern that affects the overall health of individuals and families even before the COVID-19 epidemic. Women are disproportionately affected by DV compared to men, and context, such as social determinants of health (SDOH), has a key effect on overall health risk exposures, including DV victimization. In this session, we will examine:

1. the relationship with SDOH, as measured by the Area Deprivation Index (ADI), and the severity of injury and forms of DV victimization among women (18 years of age) in Milwaukee, Wisconsin;
2. how macro-level neighborhood-SDOH variables influence women's exposure to various forms of DV victimization, giving context for law enforcement DV victimizations;
3. implications for policymakers and public health practice, particularly in terms of lowering the impact of SDOH on DV victimization in large metropolitan areas.
