

YOUR RIGHTS

- ◆ You may not be treated differently because of RACE, COLOR, or NATIONAL ORIGIN.
- ◆ You may not be treated differently because of a DISABILITY.
- ◆ You may not be treated differently because of AGE.
- ◆ You have the right to receive information in a language that you understand at no cost to you.
- ◆ If you have a disability and need program information in an alternate format, you have the right to receive it at no cost to you.

If you feel you have been treated differently by this agency because of your race, color, national origin, handicap, political affiliation, religion, citizenship or age, you may file a complaint with any of the following:
