### **The Special Needs Support Program**

helps families and caregivers with onsite technical assistance and monthly educational classes. Caregivers learn how to care for children with disabilities and health care needs.

### **Who is Eligible?**

Families that are participating in Wisconsin Shares or receiving child care subsidy assistance through W-2 are eligible for services.

### **Family Services:**

- Assistance updating child care authorizations.
- Verification of child's disability for benefits and services.
- Free onsite training for the child care provider on child's needs.
- Networking and support through monthly educational classes and connections to community resources.
- Assistance for parents of teens 13 years of age and older that continue to need care.
- Resources to help families find a child care provider that best fits their needs.



### **What is Milwaukee Early Care Administration (MECA)?**

MECA trains, certifies and oversees family child care providers. We also work with parents to sign up for Wisconsin Shares child care subsidy.

### **What does the Special Needs Support Program do?**

- Enhance the quality and availability of child care programs for children with special needs.
- Support child care providers serving children with special needs.
- Increase caregiver awareness of new practices that benefit children with special needs.

### **Provider Services:**

- Training onsite by professionals who share information and strategies to care for children with special needs
- Educational classes on a variety of health care topics and disabilities.
- Credit for continuing education with The Registry (tier levels listed for each class on The Registry website).
