It requires the student to volunteer at least 30 hours in an ECE program with a child who has special needs and to spend time with that child's family at home and in the community during the course dates. Students will have the opportunity to participate with a child and family in daily routines and community settings (i.e. church, child care, shopping, medical settings, etc.). Students will complete the required portfolio and culminate in the Wisconsin Registry Commission process.

Registration starts June 15 Course Fee: TBD Call NWTC: 1-888-385-6982	Providers learn about a child's social emotional development; building positive relationships; the environment, including schedules, routines and transitions; planning activities that promote engagement in both large and small groups; giving directions; and teaching children classroom rules. Learn how to help children control anger while learning impulse control, friendship skills and problem solving skills. Positive Behavior Support (PBS) is the groundwork for these sessions: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • What does challenging behavior mean to the child? • Prevention strategies to address behaviors. Change how you view behavior, respond to behavior and incorporate skill instruction throughout the day.
