


Choose the type of child care


Children and Families

Think about what type of child care best fits your needs. You can choose one or all the following:

Group: A licensed provider who can care for nine or more children. These are usually in a commercial setting.

Family Provider: A licensed or certified provider who can care for four to eight children, which generally takes place in the provider's home.

Day Camps: Licensed seasonal programs that can care for four or more children above age 3. These are usually in an outdoor setting.


