
Is my business eligible to accept Wisconsin Shares?

What if I am an out-of-state provider?

Providers who are located outside of Wisconsin may be eligible to accept Wisconsin Shares child care subsidies. How do I become a regulated provider?

In Wisconsin, licensed and voluntarily certified child care providers are regulated by the Wisconsin Department of Children and Families (DCF). YoungStar is Wisconsin's child care quality rating and improvement system. It objectively measures child care quality using a simple, 5-Star scale.
