The following resources are being offered as a starting point to locate data that you can use to create your own unique and innovative child welfare housing support initiative. These data points can also help you identify potential partners to develop a robust cross collaborative team.

- **USDA** collects information on housing status as part of the certification process for the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP). [Food Stamp Offices in Wisconsin | Benefits Explorer](#)
