### Child Abuse and Neglect Prevention Board (s. 15.205(4))\*

#### Description

The Child Abuse and Neglect Prevention Board was created by the Legislature in 1983 as the lead state agency on child abuse and neglect prevention efforts in Wisconsin. The agency's work is grounded in the strengths-based Protective Factors Framework utilizing a public health approach which incorporates a continuum of prevention strategies to strengthen families. The Prevention Board promotes and supports community-based, family-centered strategies to prevent child abuse and neglect while strengthening family protective factors.

The Prevention Board strategic plan provides a roadmap for its work to prevent first time occurrences of child maltreatment. The strategic plan is comprised of four strategies with key initiatives to advance the Board's mission and vision. Annually, the Prevention Board creates a Community Investment Plan reflecting its policy, program, professional development and public awareness priorities.

#### Description

The Governor's Council on Domestic Abuse (Council) advises the Department of Children and Families and the legislature on domestic abuse funding and policy issues. The Council also serves as a sounding board and resource for citizens of the State on domestic abuse issues.

#### Membership

The Council consists of thirteen members appointed for three-year terms. Of those 13 members, nine are nominated by the Governor, with advice and consent of the Senate. The other members are designated, for appointment by the Governor (\*\*), by the speaker of the assembly, senate majority leader, and the minority leader in each house of the legislature. ## Governor's Early Childhood Advisory Council (Head Start Act of 2007)\*

### Description

The Governor's Early Childhood Advisory Council (ECAC) was formed as a result of the Head Start Reauthorization Act of 2007. This Council is building upon the work of the Wisconsin Early Childhood Collaborating Partners (WECCP), the Child Abuse and Neglect Prevention Board, and the Governor's Birth to Three Interagency Coordinating Council. The mission of the Council is to help ensure that all children and families in Wisconsin have access to quality early childhood programs and services.

The Council is responsible for: (1) conducting a periodic, statewide needs assessment concerning the availability and quality of early childhood education and development programs (2) identifying opportunities for, and barriers to, collaborating and coordination among Federally-funded and State-funded child development, child care, and early childhood education programs and services (3) develop recommendations for increasing overall participation of children in existing Federal, State, and local child care and early childhood education programs including outreach of underrepresented and special populations (4) develop recommendations regarding statewide professional development and career advancement plans for early childhood educators in the state.

## Intertribal Child Welfare (ICW) Committee

### Description

The Intertribal Child Welfare (ICW) Committee discusses child welfare-related issues, including but not limited to policy and program changes and development. In addition, child welfare and legal staff of the Department and Tribes, along with professionals from related organizations (e.g., Children’s Court Improvement Program) meet upon request of the ICW Directors as the Tribal/State Child Welfare Policy & Law (PALS) Workgroup to discuss policy and legal issues.

### Membership

Membership of the ICW Committee is comprised of Indian Child Welfare (ICW) Directors from each of the 11 federally-recognized tribes headquartered in Wisconsin and others they designate, such as tribal attorneys and family/social services directors. Leadership from DCF’s Division of Safety and Permanence, the DCF Tribal Liaison, and DCF’s Bureau of Regional Operations regularly participate in the ICW Committee meetings.

## State-Tribal IV-D Meeting

### Description

The Division of Family and Economic Security, the Bureau of Child Support Director and DCF staff meet with tribal child support programs on a quarterly basis to share information on child support initiatives impacting tribal IV-D programs. This group also discuss legal issues, policies and legislation.

### Membership

The Tribal IV-D Directors, tribal attorney's and leadership from DCF's Division of Family and Economic Security, Bureau of Child Support, and Bureau of Regional Operations participate in these meetings. Staff from the Region V Office of Child Support Enforcement are also invited to attend and provide updates.

## Wisconsin Inter Tribal Child Care Association

### Description

The purpose of the Wisconsin Inter Tribal Child Care Association (WITCCA) is to promote inter-tribal networking, communication, information sharing, support and encouragement of Wisconsin's Child Care Tribal Directors/Departments. WITCCA respects and fosters effective relationships with other governmental and state agencies, organizations, and entities. We work cooperatively and collectively, to promote and address Tribal child care issues and topics

### Membership

Invitations are sent to tribal child care managers and program directors as well as tribal head start directors. These tribal representatives comprise the WITCCA; however, representatives from DCF and child care stakeholder groups are also invited to provide updates, information, technical assistance, and support.

## Stakeholder Calls

### Description

Each division and the Secretary's Office continue to hold stakeholder calls to provide updates or solicit feedback on specific initiatives. During the legislative season, stakeholder calls regarding bill packages or specific bills have been incredibly helpful to ensure stakeholders are aware of the position or concerns one another may have with particular pieces of legislation prior to the committee hearings.

### Membership

At times, Tribes are included in the larger calls with other stakeholder groups/representatives; however, both DCF and tribal representatives have found that it has been extremely helpful to engage in separate conversations with tribes specifically. This type of specific outreach continues to be done with an invitation to all of the tribes or one-on-one conversations between DCF and an individual tribe as requested or necessary.
