Funding Cycle:	Federal fiscal year (October – September); funding is for two years, with no renewal options. This funding has been offered twice. The first round was 10/01/2021 – 09/30/2023 with three tribes being awarded the funding and the second round was for 10/01/2023 – 09/30/2025 with two tribe being awarded the funding. The Prevention Board is in the planning process for next funding opportunities.		
Description (Purpose):	The purpose of this funding is to implement child maltreatment primary prevention initiatives within tribal communities. Grantees will provide universal, child maltreatment primary prevention parenting and family support to families with children ages birth to 17, with a focus on families with children ages birth to five.		
Target Population:	All families with children		
Program Requirements:	Funds must be used to implement new child maltreatment primary prevention initiatives or to expand existing child maltreatment primary prevention initiatives.

Program Requirements:	The objective of this grant is to shift organizational culture, build intentionality, increase awareness, and facilitate the process of continuous quality improvement through the Wisconsin Family Resource Center Model , an asset-based approach to build strengths within FRCs, promote the child well-being, and implement child maltreatment primary prevention strategies.
