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Description (Purpose):	The goal of the Child Abuse and Neglect (CAN) Prevention Grants is to expand prevention services aimed at reducing the contact families may have with the child welfare system and preventing the removal of children from their homes. Given the long-term impact that child maltreatment can have on a child's life, these grants expand the child abuse and neglect prevention service array through the implementation of evidence-based programs or evidence-informed innovative strategies to meet a community's specific needs.			
Target Population:	 The target population eligible for Child Abuse and Neglect Prevention services will be any of the following populations: Parents or relatives caring for children who are at risk of contact with the child welfare system or in contact with the child welfare system and have a child at risk of removal from the home.
