Transition to Success is a community based, transformational change, social enterprise business model. The goal is national adoption of uniform protocols and analytics designed to treat the condition of poverty across health, human services, government, education, and faith-based organizations.

All levels of TTS certifications are authorized to provide direct care, lead community forums and maintain organizational TTS orientations. All levels include unlimited, unrestricted authorization to reproduce Coach and Map of My Dreams Workbooks.

Once you have successfully completed your TTS training you are immediately eligible for TTS Coach Certification.

This Certification recognizes you as a leader in a national transformational movement, identifying and treating poverty as an environmentally based medical condition and not a character flaw. As a TTS Coach you have specialized training and understanding and are prepared to: help others understand poverty; assist in mapping dreams by accessing and holding accountable all supports and services; promote hope by promoting volunteerism, mentoring, financial literacy; and define the path to improved health and economic self-sufficiency.

The TTS Coach Certification requires 22.5 hours of training time. The training covers many topics including: the TTS vision, mission, and goals; diversity; poverty myths and statistics; accountability; champions and advocates; continuous quality improvement; standards of care; the social determinants of heath, person centered practice; cultural competency; trauma informed care; motivational interviewing and engagement; the Map of My Dreams; volunteering and mentoring; building our CARE (Coordinating All Resources Effectively) Network; and integrating TTS into practice.
