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Federal Compliance - Ed Emmons and Pete Shay

- Agencies will receive WPR CAP letters, if they have not already.
- Two-parent WPR is a separate category with a separate penalty.
 - Our target is 45.9% the current rate is around this number.
 - o If we meet the rate for FFY 2018, the penalty will end.
 - Currently there are 100 two-parent cases statewide. Agencies were encouraged to work these cases in an effort to get the current rate up to expected levels since we are so close.
- Agencies have received the W-2 T Participant Engagement Incentive payments.
 - Agencies need to ensure that participants are assigned appropriate activities and hours to avoid a takeback.
 - Two agency representatives expressed concern about takebacks.
 - Agencies cannot submit reports directly.
 - As long as the hours and activities are appropriate, takebacks will not happen.
 - o See Ops Memo 18-08 for more information.
- RAS recently sent a listserv notice containing a list of unused Webl reports that will be archived.
 - o Agencies should notify RAS if they still need any of the reports on the list.
 - o Folders will also be reorganized to make items easier to find.
- According to the newly proposed TANF reauthorization bill, WPR will no longer be the performance standard.
 - States will need to develop their own performance standards by 2020. This will benefit
 Wisconsin since our service delivery model is unique.

Contract Issues - Jason Bergh and Carrie Johnson

- EA YTD spending is 65% of what it was last year.
 - Agency representatives indicated that the spending difference is due to a combination of a decrease in applications and increase in ineligible applicants.
 - o There is also seasonal variation in the number of EA applications.
- The TMJ RFP will be posted by the end of next week.
 - o There will continue to be separate contracts for the foster and general populations.
 - o The new contracts will begin in January 1, 2019.
 - The due date for proposals is TBD (probably in early August).

- The WWP preview recently concluded.
 - o Previewers provided helpful written feedback.
 - o The full release of WWP Phase I is on track for February 2019.
 - o The debrief meeting is next week.

Policy Updates - Jenifer Cole and Nick Hayward

- Refusal to Participate will become effective on August 1.
 - Automation will go live on October 27.
 - Cases with two consecutive months of 20% or more hours sanctioned without good cause will need to be closed for three months.
 - The case will not auto close.
 - Participants will not receive payments during the sanction period.
 - Notices will be sent to participants in advance of being sanctioned with instructions on how to claim good cause.
 - Participants subject to Refusal to Participate will need to reapply if they wish to participate in W-2.
- TJ will expand to Adams, Clark, Jackson, and Juneau counties on July 1.
 - o This geographic area will be known as Rural Central.
 - An Ops Memo will be published next week.
- BWF is working to update policies and processes related to individuals participating in the Safe at Home program.
 - Safe at Home provides a substitute address to individuals who fear for their safety.
 - o If FEPs have a client who is a Safe at Home participant, they must enter the substitute address in CWW.
 - o A new CWW process help document will be published next week.
 - An Ops Memo will be published in July.
