

A new report called **WPR Report 06: Activity and Placement History for Single Individual** has been published to the DCF / WISDOM / Employment Programs / Wisconsin Works / Work Participation Rate Incentives folder in WebI.

Background: This report was originally created as a tool to help Research and Statistics (R&S) staff determine exactly why certain individuals were not meeting Work Participation Rate (WPR) requirements for work related activities and to look at the individual's activity history to see if they were meeting the WPR requirements over time (or had ever met those requirements). It is being made available to Agency and Department of Children and Families (DCF) staff to assist them in the same efforts. While some of the information may be more than needed, the report is intended to provide the information that might be needed to allow staff to make their own determination of trends or behaviors across time.

Purpose: This report was created to help DCF staff determine why specific individuals are not meeting the federal WPR requirements. It is intended as a tool to assist in research efforts. This report shows the entire activity and placement history for a given individual.

Description of Report: This report gives all WPR, Activity, Participation, and Placement data for a single individual, for all of the cases they were a part of. For individuals who have been in the system for a long time, this can be an overwhelming amount of data, and may exceed 50 pages of 11x17 paper! **This report is not meant to be printed!** Data entry errors are also more obvious in this report! There are four tabs on this report – Monthly activities and participation data, WPR summary by month, monthly placement summary, and all placement records (similar to what can be seen on WPPS - W-2 Placement Summary screen in the mainframe). Using this data, staff can determine trends and even specific instances of activity assignments and participation that impact WPR for the selected individual. The first tab allows staff to more easily see how “assigned” hours translate to “worked” hours after time limits and non-participation have been accounted for. The second tab provides a monthly summary of the first tab (without activities and participation). Tabs three and four allow staff to see all monthly placements, not just paid placements, and associated dates to help fill in some of the gaps.

Prompts: Individual PIN is a mandatory prompt.

How to Use the Report: Input an individual PIN into the prompt. While this report can be run individually, it can also be reference via hyperlink from other reports. Currently, WPR Report 05 links to this report.
