A new report called WPR Report 04a: Individuals need to achieve WPR has been published in the DCF / WISDOM / Employment Programs / Wisconsin Works / Work Participation Rate Incentives WEBI folder. This report was created to be inclusive of all individuals required to meet WPR requirements and to assist agencies with their WPR monitoring of participant cases.

Background: This report was designed as an extension of WPR Report 04. This report was requested by the Bureau of Working Families management team to show cases that need to meet both 20 and 30 required hours to achieve the WPR. This report specifically shows all cases that need to meet federal requirements no matter how many hours they are from meeting the federally required number of hours.

Purpose: The purpose of this report is to provide agencies with the entire list of participants who are not yet meeting WPR requirements from the participants who need a few more hours to those who are participating in zero hours. This ensures that the agencies will have the entire list of participants that they need to schedule federally countable hours to help them fulfill the WPR requirements.

Description of Report:

Prompts: The mandatory prompts are Report Month and Work Program Contract Agency.

This report has four different tabs that separate out individuals with 20 or more required hours from participants who are required to meet 20 hours and 30 hours. The fourth tab of this report connects directly to the RP740TANF- W2 TANF Activities Detail Report to show what activities these individuals who are not meeting WPR requirements are scheduled to attend.
