Accessibility Tools

Adobe Color: <https://color.adobe.com/create/color-contrast-analyzer>

- In the **Create** section, use the **Accessibility Tools** tab to check the contrast ratio. You can also check to see if the colors are color blind safe. If the colors do not pass the contrast ratio, the website suggests different colors for you to try that do pass.

Accessible Colors: <https://accessible-colors.com/>

Enter your text and background color to get the contrast ratio. If it does not pass, the website suggests different colors for you to try. They modify the lightness values only in order to stay as true to the original color as possible.

Adobe Color: <https://color.adobe.com/create/color-wheel>

- In the **Create** section, use the **Color Wheel** tab to create harmonious colors that make a palette by starting with a base color. Use the **Extract Theme** and **Extract Gradient** tabs to have Adobe Color automatically extract a color palette theme or a color gradient from an image you upload.
- Use the **Explore** and **Trends** tabs to search for color palettes and discover current color trends.

Upload an image to have the palette generator create a color palette based on the predominant colors in your image. You can also select a specific section of the image to take the sample from.
